One of the things I enjoy the most about my job is being able to visit classrooms unannounced from time to time and observe teachers engaging with students in that wonderful journey of discovery and learning. My work day is usually pretty hectic, and sometimes I feel like a circus performer spinning multiple plates all at once while riding a unicycle blindfolded. Getting out of my office and into a classroom is definitely far more relaxing and enjoyable.

For the most part, my visits are informal and unannounced. They get me out of my office, but also provide useful information for teacher feedback, and in some cases, a final evaluation. My staff are used to this and usually very welcoming. They are proud of the work they do and rarely give me a glance as I try to slide unobtrusively into an empty chair near the back of their classroom. If students are working independently or in small groups, I'll sometimes walk quietly around to look over their shoulders, or blend into whatever activity is underway. It's a good way to learn first-hand what's going on in their learning.

On occasion I find myself being drawn into a lesson and end up putting away my little notepad to simply watch and listen in fascination. Such was the case today when I wandered into Mrs. Warner's 9th grade Algebra class. To be honest, I was never a great math student myself, being far more interested in sports and the social element in high school rather than academics. I did manage to get B's and C's my senior year, but only because I was blessed with a teacher who was also my basketball coach.

Today in Mrs. Warner's class, however, I was completely absorbed in a math lesson about multiplying monomials by polynomials (or something like that), by a teacher who is both inspiring and in sync with her students. What might have put me sound asleep as a 16-year-old, now seemed like one of the most engaging experiences of my life.

What made the difference? Part of it, I suppose, is that I'm older and more mature (although my wife would have a second opinion on that). But the reality is that this particular teacher has a special connection with her students, and strives to make each lesson engaging and useful. Like all NCCS teachers, she is loving, nurturing, knowledgeable and dedicated to meeting the needs of each and every student. We are family, and like most families, there is a bond that sticks and stays. The students in Mrs. Warner's classroom today (including myself) were completely engaged in learning, and actually enjoying the process.

I praise God for all our teachers and what they provide for our learning community. Perhaps if I had been at NCCS when I was a high school student, I wouldn't have needed my basketball coach to get me through.
