I love Wednesday morning Chapels. It's a special time when NCCS students at every level take time out of their daily academic schedules to pray, sing praises of worship, and listen to an inspiring message of promise and hope, usually from an adult. This last Chapel meeting was particularly interesting in that both elementary and secondary sessions were led entirely by students.

Our elementary group had a family chapel, where fifth and sixth grade students came into each lower elementary classroom to present an Easter message and lead the younger students in discussion and prayer. It was amazing to see the interaction and mentoring taking place as all students sat together and shared the Easter story of love and salvation.

In the Junior High/High School Chapel, our talented student worship team led everyone in two or three songs of praise, followed by a wonderful 25-minute message on Jonah and the whale and its lesson of defiance and forgiveness. Usually these are presented by a youth pastor or other adult speaker, but this time it was prepared and delivered by one of our own senior students, Natalie Sale.

Natalie is no stranger to public speaking, and she's definitely not shy about her faith. As one of our worship leaders, she always has something profound to say about a particular song and its meaning for our Christian lives. Her engaging personality and deep love for the Lord helps bring joy and meaning to every worship Chapel. But the message she delivered this past Wednesday, was delivered solely from her heart and without any visible notes, other than the open Bible placed on the music stand in front of her. Natalie had her young teenage audience in the palm of her hand and was able to skillfully weave a story about man's defiance of God's will and the consequences of sin and disobedience. She spoke with a presence and maturity that few adults could have managed.

This is what I love about NCCS. God uses students and staff alike to share the love of Christ and help promote a Godly culture of commitment and devotion. Each day I pray that He will continue to use our older students to mentor and lead the young. It's what makes our school so unique and powerful.


It's Veggie Time!
