This Wednesday afternoon caught me by surprise. I've worked in eight different schools over the past forty-two years, and at no time when I was about to leave did I have a problem standing up in front of a staff and saying, "Thanks for the memories...we'll stay in touch." It was just a job, after all, and even though I liked the people I worked with, they were simply casual friends and working associates. Nothing to get emotional about.

But this last Wednesday was different. I'd planned for weeks to make an announcement regarding my decision to leave NCCS, but it was to be no big deal. In fact, I was to make the announcement at a routine staff meeting – no fuss, no muss...and definitely no emotion. I was certain I could pull this off in my usual cool and collected manner – a short speech, a few hugs, and then jump on my trusty horse and ride off into the sunset.

Unfortunately, I was completely deluded. "What was I thinking?" I asked myself as I entered the staff meeting that afternoon. The friends I've made here at NCCS have been quite amazing, and unlike any I've had in my previous schools. For one, I found that I was completely connected with all of them – not just emotionally, but spiritually. It's what the Greek New Testament refers to as "Philia" love – a powerful emotional bond found in Christian friendships.

Here I was, ready to cut the cord once again. But it was different this time. From the moment I tried to get the words out of my mouth, I choked with emotion and my eyes began to water. I looked around, somewhat embarrassed, but still couldn't form the words I needed. I was completely overwhelmed. And then I realized that this had been the reason I had come here in the first place. I had been in public schools my entire career, and it had been a spiritual desert the whole time. My ability to express my love of Christ had been totally suppressed. But being at NCCS with these people had drawn me closer to God, and I was finally able to be myself for the first time in decades.

I love my staff, and for this reason I've found this separation to be harder than ever. To be honest, I've never served a more wonderful group of Christian men and women in my life. I can only hope and pray that whoever follows in my footsteps next fall will realize quickly the gift they are about to inherit. It took me a while, but last Wednesday I realized what an awe-some gift God had given me four-and-a-half years ago. And I will never forget the men and women of NCCS who made my job so joyful and fulfilling. Thank you!


Financial Aid 2019-20
