Earlier this morning, while driving my son and I to school, I began thinking about the wonderful assembly our staff and students put on for me yesterday in recognition of my impending retirement from NCCS. To say the least, I was overwhelmed. Even this morning, my heart was still filled with emotion as I thought about the hundreds of students surround-ing me at center court and singing "I love you Lord." It was the most incredible feeling I've had in years.

I chuckled to myself, however, as my mind drifted back to a morning four years earlier. I was having coffee with a close friend and former public school colleague. He and I retired together from the same public school district some years earlier and we would occasionally get together just to "shoot the breeze." That morning, however, I had informed him of my decision to come out of retirement and be the new principal at a small Christian school in Oregon City. Needless to say, he was not as supportive as I had hoped.

"Tutty," he said as he almost spit out a mouthful of coffee. "Are you insane?!" I sat quietly, smiling, as my friend tried to gather his thoughts while wiping coffee from his chin.

"You've been in the good life for months...and now you're tossing it in? You've not only failed retirement, but now you're jumping right back into the frying pan. What's up with that? Are you tired of taking naps?"

Of course, he had just informed me minutes earlier that he and his wife would soon be leaving on a two-week vacation to Hawaii, followed by a month-long tour of Italy and Greece.

That memorable coffee meeting now resonated in my mind as I thought about leaving NCCS. Had I really jumped back into "the frying pan" these past four-and-a-half years? Pulling up to a stoplight, I dismissed the thought immediately, knowing that God had clearly called me to serve Him and wanted me to come to this school.

As a public school administrator, my job had usually been fraught with all kinds of trials and hassles. If it wasn't angry parents storming my office about late buses, or a union representative complaining about a contract issue, it was some kids lighting a trash can on fire in the boy's restroom, or high schoolers smoking behind the football stadium. I knew, of course, that none of these activities would likely be happening at NCCS when I took the job, but I also knew there would still be challenges. My assurance, however, was knowing that God would be there by my side to give me guidance and provide solutions.

As our car neared the entrance to NCCS, I quickly prayed and thanked God for His wonderful grace and wisdom over these past four-and-a-half years. I had made mistakes, for sure, but only when I'd forgotten to seek His guidance first. This was a lesson I would continue to learn throughout the remainder of my life.

Pulling into my parking spot, I immediately shouted a spontaneous "Thank you Lord!" while pumping my fist in the air. In the rear view mirror I could see my ten-year-old son looking back at me in a surprised but amused manner, his eyebrows raised in mock horror.

"Daaad...what are you doing?"

"Nothing, son," I said with a reassuring smile, hoping to convince him that his retiring father was not going insane. "I'm just thanking God for putting me back in the "frying pan."

NCCS Track Runners Succeed at State Meet



This year's OSAA Track and Field Championship was held at Western Oregon University in Monmouth. Our two state meet representatives from NCCS were Breanna Steele and Ian Watt, both running in the open 400 meter.

Breanna capped her season with five PRs in five races, running the Friday prelim in 64.02 seconds. Though the time did not get her into the finals, it would have placed her on the podium if she had run in the finals.

"I am so thankful for the constant obstacles I'm thrown and for the opportunity to grow in God," said Breanna after her effort. "It was deeper than I could have imagined."

Ian has been chasing the 400-meter school record all season long, ending just short of that goal. His coach indicates that it is well within reach during his Senior

season next year. Finishing fourth in the prelims, Ian ran an excellent tactical race in the finals, placing third overall and beating an individual he has been chasing all season.

Ian was encouraged by the number of folks who came to cheer and encourage. "It was a really fun experience and I appreciate the people that came to watch," he said. "They made the day even more memorable."

Senior Send-Off – May 29th

Each year NCCS does a "Senior Send-Off" where students and parents are invited to cheer on and encourage our senior students as they prepare to graduate and leave NCCS for the last time. All parents are invited to attend this wonderful event, which takes place in the gymnasium, beginning at 2:25 p.m. on Wednesday, May 29th. Following is the schedule of events and their times:

- **<u>2:25</u>** Elementary classes, staff, and parents come to gym and line the perimeter of the basketball court; seniors will run in through the doors and high five people standing around the perimeter of the basketball court.
- 2:30 Senior Send-Off
 - Seniors run through the gym for high fives
 - Juniors form tunnel as seniors come through (like basketball season)
 - Senior parents circle around center court with their child's bucket to hand off when seniors get to the middle
 - Seniors end up in center of gym and form a circle
 - Everyone else forms a circle around them and all sing "I Love You Lord"
 - Pray over the seniors (designated junior opener/closers)
 - Elementary goes out to carpool, while the rest of the secondary students go to 7th period
