-May 16 @ 6:15 p.m. The North Clackamas Christian School Excelsior Choir sang with their heart last Monday afternoon at the OSAA 1A/2A State Choir Championship in Corvallis. The result was a state championship for the fourth year in a row! During the competition the 17-member choir earned scores of 91, 89 and 91 from the three-judge panel. They then scored a tournament high of 54 in sight-reading for a final winning score of 325.

"This year we had a special focus in our song set," stated Mrs. Steele, NCCS Choir Director. "Particularly with the songs 'Please Stay' and 'O Love.' It brought a message of hope to all who struggle with depression or thoughts of suicide."

Other people in the audience seemed to agree. One spectator commented, "I watched and listened, and then realized how emotionally cathartic these songs were for me. I appreciated (NCCS's) wisdom and sensitivity in choosing to share this incredible message. I was deeply touched by their message and performance."

Sophomore Caleb Matias shared his favorite memory from the competition: "Just being on stage and knowing that we touched someone's life was amazing. We're all really young, but we shared our hearts and touched people's lives."

In response to a question about what makes Excelsior Choir unique, Senior Natalie Sale summarized her thoughts by saying, "It was the mission and the passion behind every song, every note, and even every rest."

Preschool teacher, Debbie Stark also commented, "I love that (Mrs. Steele) always gets them to sing with their whole being. They left their hearts on the stage."

Probably the most impressive comment made to Mrs. Steele came from one of the judges at the end of the competition: "You know the really beautiful thing about your singing is that I want to listen to it. You represent (your songs) very successfully and internalized; obviously you've thought about this. You also sing from the heart," he said with a smile. "And it has that sense of purpose in sound, which is really compelling. You should be congratulated for that. You perform as a group and there is a 'we' rather than an 'l' that comes through your sing-ing."

What a blessing Mrs. Steele, Mrs. Bard, and our entire Excelsior Choir has been at NCCS this past year. God has given our young singers a wonderful gift, and they've used it to share the joy and happiness of Christ's abundant love. I'm sure there were many schools, both public and private, that gave their best effort that afternoon. All, I'm sure, were very talented. But

the message heard from NCCS was far more than just singing. It was a manifestation of God's love and hope through Christ.
